



Ontario Regional Council Members Work Description

Within the Regional Council's Mandate, the Activities and Roles for Council Members are:

- a) Be a visible PSAC presence in the field;
- b) Attend Council Meetings;
- c) Serve on Regional Council Committees as required;
- d) Provide written reports to Regional Council on a timely basis;
- e) Encourage Council members and alternates within a geographic area work together on mobilizing members;
- f) Identify Locals, Committees, and Area Councils in area of responsibility and establish a two-way communication network;
- g) Identify Local, Committee, Area Council needs including educational needs;
- h) Inform Locals, Committees, Area Councils about Regional Council and its' role;
- i) Bring Regional Council campaigns and issues to Locals, Areas Councils, and Committees and bring Local, Area Council, and Committee issues to the Regional Council;
- j) Develop action plans to mobilize Locals, Area Councils, and Committees;
- k) Actively encourage and assist in the formation and provide ongoing support of PSAC Area Councils and PSAC Committees;
- l) Liase with Component counterparts;
- m) Promote affiliation of PSAC Locals to District Labour Councils and the Ontario Federation of Labour and encourage the involvement of PSAC members in Labour Councils and on Labour Council Committees;
- n) Identify, develop and implement political/social action campaigns/activities;
- o) Network to develop organizing contacts with unorganized workers, work on organizing drives to bring new members into the union;
- p) Identify and network with Coalition Groups within geographic areas;

- q) Liase with Regional Office Staff;
- r) Provide financial reports in writing within prescribed deadlines;
- s) Promote Young Workers and Equity issues and the involvement of Young Workers and Equity Seeking members in the Union;
- t) Ensure ongoing communication between the Council Members and their alternates;
- u) Provide a transition report to new Council Members.
