Gary Yee has been appointed full-time chair of three Ontario tribunals since 1993. After retiring from his last tribunal position in 2019, Gary currently volunteers on two boards – the Chinese Canadian National Council for Social Justice and Tribunal Watch Ontario (which advocates for independent and accessible tribunals). He was the first executive director of the Metro Toronto Chinese & Southeast Asian

Legal Clinic (1987 - 1992). His later positions included manager of legal services at Ombudsman Ontario, and Special Advisor to the Deputy Chairperson of the Immigration Appeal Division at the Immigration and Refugee Board (1999 - 2009).

As part of his extensive community involvement, Gary was National President of the Chinese Canadian National Council from 1987 to 1991. He has been on the Law Society of Ontario's Equity Advisory Group, and the Boards of CCAT (Council of Canadian Administrative Tribunals), SOAR (Society of Ontario Adjudicators and Regulators) and FACL (Federation of Asian Canadian Lawyers). He has received the SOAR Medal, the FACL Public Sector Lawyer Award, and the Law Society Medal.
